In grades K-3, students need explicit instruction to bridge the gaps in math and reading. Smaller class sizes allow for a teacher to give that level of support. Research says that growth in smaller classes outpaces larger, giving a chance for students to make more than marginal growth. Teacher are able to give more individualized instruction and create even smaller groups to specialize student needs.

With smaller class sizes, we can achieve greater heights for our children and for our future leaving less room for inequity. I urge you to consider the whole child and the people teaching our children. What is best for them? Where would you want your child to learn? What does that classroom environment look like to you?
